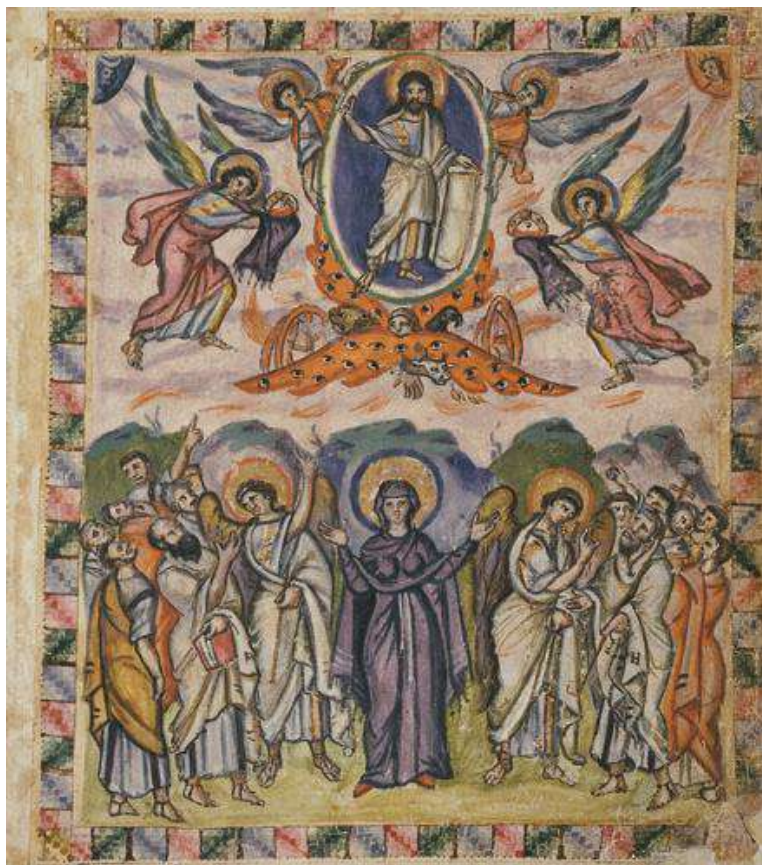

Readings of the Day / Las lecturas del día

A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

Acts 1:6-14

Then they gathered around him and asked him, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?" He said to them: "It is not for you to know the times or dates the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." After he said this, he was taken up before their very eyes, and a cloud hid him from their sight. They were looking intently up into the sky as he was going, when suddenly two men dressed in white stood beside them. "Men of Galilee," they said, "why do you stand here looking into the sky? This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven." Then the apostles returned to Jerusalem from the hill called the Mount of Olives, a Sabbath day's walk from the city. When they arrived, they went upstairs to the room where they were staying. Those present were Peter, John, James and Andrew; Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew; James son of Alphaeus and Simon the Zealot, and Judas son of James. They all joined together constantly in prayer, along with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brothers.

Hechos 1:6-14

Entonces los que estaban reunidos con él le preguntaron: Señor, ¿es ahora cuando vas a restablecer el reino a Israel? Este mismo Jesús, que ha sido llevado de entre ustedes al cielo, vendrá otra vez de la misma manera que lo han visto irse. Entonces regresaron a Jerusalén desde el monte llamado de los Olivos, situado aproximadamente a un kilómetro de la ciudad. Cuando llegaron, subieron al lugar donde se alojaban. Estaban allí Pedro, Juan, Jacobo, Andrés, Felipe, Tomás, Bartolomé, Mateo, Jacobo hijo de Alfeo, Simón el Zelote y Judas hijo de Jacobo. Todos, en un mismo espíritu, se dedicaban a la oración, junto con las mujeres y con los hermanos de Jesús y su madre María.

Psalm 68: 1-10, 32-35

May God arise, may his enemies be scattered; may his foes flee before him. May you blow them away like smoke as wax melts before the fire, may the wicked perish before God. But may the righteous be glad and rejoice before God; ay they be happy and joyful. Sing to God, sing in praise of his name, extol him who rides on the clouds; rejoice before him his name is the LORD. A father to the fatherless, a defender of widows, is God in his holy dwelling. God sets the lonely in families, he leads out the prisoners with singing; but the rebellious live in a sun-scorched land. When you, God, went out before your people, when you marched through the wilderness, the earth shook, the heavens poured down rain, before God, the One of Sinai, before God, the God of Israel. You gave abundant showers, O God; you refreshed your weary inheritance. Your people settled in it, and from your bounty, God, you provided for the poor. Sing to God, you kingdoms of the earth, sing praise to the Lord, to him who rides across the highest heavens, the ancient heavens, who thunders with mighty voice. Proclaim the power of God, whose majesty is over Israel, whose power is in the heavens. You, God, are awesome in your sanctuary; the God of Israel gives power and strength to his people.

If you are insulted because of the name of Christ, you are blessed, for the Spirit of glory and of God rests on you. Humble yourselves, therefore, under God's mighty hand, that he may lift you up in due time. Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you. Be alert and of sober mind. Your enemy the devil prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour. Resist him, standing firm in the faith, because you know that the family of believers throughout the world is undergoing the same kind of sufferings. And the God of all grace, who called you to his eternal glory in Christ, after you have suffered a little while, will himself restore you and make you strong, firm and steadfast. Acknowledgment of Indigenous Territory

This sacred land on which we gather is the traditional territory of several Indigenous nations - the Wendat, the Anishinabek Nation, the Haudenosaunee Confederacy, the Mississaugas of Scugog, Hiawatha and Alderville First Nations and the Métis Nation. This territory was the subject of the Dish With One Spoon Wampum Belt Covenant, an agreement between the Iroquois Confederacy, the Ojibwe, and allied nations to peaceably share and care for the resources around the Great Lakes. The treaties that were signed for this particular parcel of land are collectively referred to as the Williams Treaties of 1923. In the spirit of that Treaty we seek to place at the center of our gatherings the values of respectful reciprocity, diversity, peace, responsibility, and mutual aid.

Reconocimiento del Territorio Indígena

Esta tierra sagrada en la que nos reunimos es el territorio tradicional de varias naciones indígenas: los Wendat, la Nación Anishinabek, la Confederación Haudenosaunee, los Mississaugas de Scugog, las Primeras Naciones Hiawatha y Alderville y la Nación Métis. Este territorio fue objeto del Pacto Dish With One Spoon Wampum Belt Covenant, un acuerdo entre la Confederación Iroquesa, los Ojibwe y las naciones aliadas para compartir y cuidar pacíficamente los recursos alrededor de los Grandes Lagos. Los tratados que se firmaron para esta parcela de tierra en particular se conocen colectivamente como los Tratados Williams de 1923. En el espíritu de ese Tratado, buscamos colocar en el centro de nuestras reuniones los valores de reciprocidad respetuosa, diversidad, paz, responsabilidad, y ayuda mutua.

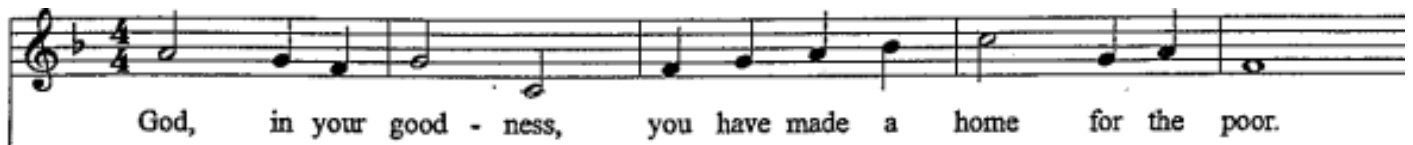
